## Guidance: treating suspected infection of enteral stoma site

GP / DOCTOR	<ul> <li>Refer patient to GP/ ward doctor for initial review of stoma site</li> <li>Follow guidance as per steps below</li> </ul>
SWAB	<ul> <li>Swab stoma site and send for culture/sensitivity to ascertain microbial infection (before cleaning site)</li> <li>Clean site with Prontosan wash 2-3 times daily until results known</li> </ul>
TREAT AND REVIEW	<ul> <li>If infection appears localised, commence treatment with topical antimicrobial/corticosteroid combination cream such as Fucidin H (this can be started prior to return of swab results)</li> <li>If infection suspected to be systemic await swab results in order to prescribe topical/systemic drug as recommended by microbiologist</li> <li>Clean stoma site 2-3 times daily with Prontosan wash</li> <li>Apply antimicrobial cream 2-3 times daily after cleaning</li> <li>Apply polyurethane foam or gauze keyhole dressing as needed</li> <li>Review at least every 2 weeks until healed</li> </ul>
HEALED	Once stoma site fully healed, ensure prescribed dressings/cream/ drugs are discontinued as no longer needed. Amend Prontosan wash to once daily maintenance dose
MONITOR	Continue to monitor the stoma site daily for signs of recurrent infection and ensure that the tube is secured firmly to the abdomen at all times
REFER	If no improvement to stoma site and infection continues, complete the enteral referral form on EPR
